Conference Checklist

Please confer with your administrators for any school district or school specific procedures.

- ☐ Review and follow all important dates and deadlines outlined in the Conference Guide
- ☐ Submit required school district field trip paperwork.
- ☐ Determine the total cost of attendance for your chapter, including registration, lodging, meals, and related expenses.
- ☐ Coordinate money collection procedures with your school's bookkeeper.
- ☐ Establish chapter-level deadlines for registration and payment.
- ☐ Prepare permission slips that include conference details, costs, and all required forms.
- ☐ Select two (2) voting delegates to participate in the state officer election.
- ☐ Register all members, advisors, and support staff by the designated registration deadline.
- ☐ Print the emailed invoice and carefully review it for accuracy.
- ☐ Collect member payments prior to the registration deadline.
- ☐ Submit the invoice to your school's bookkeeper for processing.
- ☐ Complete payment by credit card or mail a check to Oklahoma TSA by the payment deadline.
- ☐ Review the tentative conference agenda with attending members.
- ☐ Host a chapter meeting with parents to discuss expectations and responsibilities.
- ☐ Ensure each attendee has signed a multiple release form and that copies are maintained by the chapter advisor.
- ☐ Complete the Statement of Assurance and submit it with registration (uploaded through the registration site).
- ☐ Encourage all members to follow and engage with Oklahoma TSA on social media platforms.
- ☐ Discuss the National TSA Conference with members so they are prepared should they qualify.

Best Practices from Experienced Advisors

- Hold a parental meeting prior to the conference to clearly outline expectations and consequences.
- Create a behavioral contract with clear expectations for both members and parents to review and sign.
- Collect parent phone numbers and emergency contact information in advance.
- Collect a deposit from students who commit to attending, especially if fundraising is still in progress.
- Focus on quality over quantity; registering each student for one to three competitive events is generally the most effective approach.
- Ensure students have a balanced mix of event types, including team and individual events, as well as early and on-site competitions.
- Support students in developing their individual schedules so they feel prepared and confident.
- Establish your advisor schedule and clearly communicate it to all attendees.
- Set up a group communication platform (e.g., GroupMe or Remind) to share information quickly with attendees.
- Hold a daily chapter meeting to check in with students and provide updates.
- Ensure students have structured activities throughout the conference, including required attendance at general sessions and business meetings.
- Set clear behavioral expectations well in advance of the conference.
- Ensure students can always access an advisor.

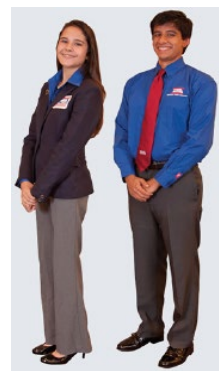

- **Shirt:** the official royal blue TSA shirt is preferred; button-down shirt or a polo/golf shirt (unacceptable: t-shirts, halter tops, tank tops)
- **Pants, or knee-length dress or skirt:** (unacceptable: jeans, exterior pocket pants, shorts, ill-fitting attire)
- **Shoes:** dress shoes worn with dark socks or hosiery (optional); open-toe shoes or sandals are acceptable (unacceptable: athletic shoes, flip-flops, military boots, or work boots)

OKLAHOMA TSA COMPETITION ATTIRE

- **Shirt:** official royal blue TSA shirt
- **Pants, or knee-length skirt:** grey (unacceptable: jeans, exterior pocket pants, shorts, ill-fitting attire)
- **Shoes:** dress shoes worn with dark socks or hosiery (optional); open-toe shoes or sandals are acceptable (unacceptable: athletic shoes, flip-flops, military boots, or work boots)

CHAPTER TEAM ATTIRE

Required for Chapter Team competitors only, but may be worn for other competitions:

- **Blazer:** navy blue with official TSA patch
- **Tie:** official TSA tie (required for males; optional for females)

OKLAHOMA TSA CASUAL ATTIRE

- **Shirt:** Conference shirt, TSA shirt, or school spirit shirt (unacceptable: halter tops, tank tops)
- **Pants:** jeans or khakis (unacceptable: ripped jeans, leggings, shorts, ill-fitting attire)

National Awards

National Technical Honor Society

Founded in 1984, the National Technical Honor Society (NTHS) is the honor society for Career and Technical Education (CTE), recognizing student achievement and providing opportunities for career development, leadership, service, and scholarships. In partnership with the Technology Student Association (TSA), NTHS extends these benefits to TSA members nationwide.

TSA students must be nominated for NTHS membership by their school's NTHS chapter advisor. Students are eligible to apply for the scholarship if they are current members of both TSA and NTHS. Scholarship applications are available through the TSA Membership System and must be submitted to general@tsaweb.org.

TSA Achievement Program, Pathways to Excellence

The TSA Achievement Program, Pathways to Excellence encourages TSA student members to engage in the areas/categories of service leadership, STEM immersion, and personal/professional development. Students participate in activities in these areas and can earn sequentially a bronze, silver, and gold award at the local, state, and national level, respectively.

Oklahoma Awards

Oklahoma Hall of Fame

The Hall of Fame award was established in 1988 to formally recognize individuals that have helped define and advance the mission of Oklahoma TSA. Induction into the Hall of Fame is considered a prestigious honor. TSA members and/or advisors can nominate an individual from one of the three categories: advisor, administration, alumni. Chapter of Excellence

The Chapter of Excellence Award recognizes chapters that have demonstrated they are a successful and quality chapter through affiliation, membership, chapter management, community service, leadership, conference attendance, national service project participation and promotion. Chapters will earn different levels of recognition based on the total activities completed in the membership year. Chapters must apply each year.

Chapter Advisor of the Year

Students are encouraged to submit the name of their chapter advisor to the state office for the Annual Advisor of the Year award. The honoree is recognized at the state conference and then again at the National Conference for their outstanding work with TSA.

OPEN TO MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

I. PURPOSE

The Oklahoma TSA Degree program recognizes TSA members who excel in knowledge of the Organization, its foundation, and its history. Those members fulfilling the requirements of the Senatorial and Presidential degree will be recognized at the annual State Conference.

II. ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY

This event is open to all High School and Middle School TSA members.

1. Senatorial Degree Requirements:

- a) Earned the TSA Congressional Degree
- b) Must have run for a local TSA chapter office
- c) Attend a TSA Fall Leadership Conference.

2. Presidential Degree Requirements:

- a) Earned the TSA Senatorial Degree
- b) Presently holding or have held a local TSA chapter office.
- c) Must have attended and competed in a competitive event at a past TSA National Conference.

III. PROCEDURE

- A. There is no limit to the number of Oklahoma TSA members from a chapter who may take the test.
- B. Oklahoma TSA members may only take each test one time per year.
- C. The Degree Program test must be proctored by the chapter advisor and an application submitted
- D. Test questions will be pulled from the National TSA and Oklahoma TSA websites, and from Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised (11th Edition). Test questions may include, but are not limited to: the motto, the colors and their meaning, officer symbols, officer duties, goals and purposes of the organization, offices of the state officers, key personnel of TSA (e.g. National Director, State Director, etc.), TSA official dress, National TSA information, TSA Creed and parliamentary procedures.

IV. EVALUATION

The Oklahoma Degree Program exams will be graded electronically. All competitors receiving a score of 90% or higher will receive a lapel pin and be recognized at the general session of the state conference.
